Marc holds a Master of Science degree in Nonprofit Management, conferred in 2021 with a 4.0 GPA, from Wilmington University in Delaware. He additionally holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Organizational Management. Relative Work Experience

For over seven years, Marc served as a Project Manager with Capstone Corporation, a Virginia-based Department of Defense contracting agency, performing general services on Dover AFB at the Joint Personnel Effects Depot. He was the company's principal on-site representative for program execution with full authority to obligate the company and managed the day-to-day administrative and operational support services of this federal contract worth over \$14.4 million. At the height of operations, he managed a workforce of 117 employees while coordinating their efforts across 20 separate functional work areas. In addition to providing primary input for the annual budget, he provided the technical operations plan for the company's contract proposals that led to two successful contract recompete acquisitions. In 2015, Marc was selected as Division Employee of the year and corporate-wide President's Award Winner for exceptional performance.

Marc is a retired Army Chief Warrant Officer 3 who served over 20 years in the Human Resources career field.
