I as stated in my executive order, we can have meetings as long as we meet local, state and national restrictions and guidance. As much as we like to think we are invincible, we are not! We need to follow proper distancing to include or meetings, if masks are required we need to wear them. We can fist/elbow bump instead of handshakes. (I know I've also been guilty)

If there is a gathering and someone there is/was positive, please let everyone know; doesn't have to be by name. PLEASE, PLEASE, PLEASE also include VFW HQ (Kdeshano@vfw.org or Kjones@vfw.org), we need to be aware and the last thing we need is for a national rep spreading it all over the country. Please do not suppress this info!!!! I don't care who has it, the word needs to get out to everyone. Keeping it a secret or threatening retaliating action will not be tolerated.
